

(1164.) WANGANUI BUTCHERS.—ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of “The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1905,” and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 28th day of November, 1906, and filed in the office of the Clerk of Awards at Wellington as No. 220, between the Wanganui Operative Butchers’ Industrial Union of Workers and the employers.

WELLINGTON, 7TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1906.
