(1977.) AUCKLAND TAILORS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of “The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908,” and its amendment; and in the matter of an award dated the 27th day of July, 1909, and made between the Auckland Tailors’ Industrial Union of Workers and the employers therein named.

THE Court, being satisfied that the following provision was accidentally omitted from the agreement of the parties and from the said award, doth hereby order that the said award be amended by the insertion of the following addition to clause 12:—

(b.) When other than weekly hands are employed at ladies’ tailoring, the work may be done, at the option of the employer, either at log rates or at the minimum rate of 1s. 4½d. per hour by the clock.
