## (1986.) NAPIER WHARF LABOURERS AND STEVEDORES.—ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD.

Provided that the provisions of the said award shall not apply to any work which heretofore has been done by any workers in the permanent employment of any of the said employers, although such workers are not usually employed at work coming within the

scope of the said award.
