

(1994.) WELLINGTON SEAMEN.—ADDING PARTY TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of “The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908,” and its amendment; and in the matter of an award dated the 4th day of April, 1908, and made between the Wellington Section of the Australasian Federated Seamen’s Industrial Union of Workers and the Aorere Steamship Company (Limited) and the other employers therein named.

TUESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1909.

UPON reading an application filed herein on the 19th day of February, 1909, and upon hearing the duly appointed representative of the applicant, the above-mentioned union, the Court doth hereby order that

The Wanganui Meat-freezing Company (Limited), Wanganui, be and it is hereby added as a party to the said award as from the date hereof :

Provided that the said Company shall be exempted from the operation of the said award when their vessels are engaged in—

- (1.) Work exclusively confined to Wanganui Harbour—that is to say, work inside the “bar,” and exclusively on the Wanganui River ;
- (2.) Tendering vessels lying at anchor in the Wanganui roadstead : this to apply exclusively to the carriage of frozen meat, &c., from the works to the vessel, and the carriage of cargo from the vessel to inside the “bar.”
