

(2193.) AUCKLAND IRONMOULDERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award made on the 11th day of April, 1910, in an industrial dispute between the Auckland Ironmoulders' Industrial Union of Workers and Adams and Co. and other employers.

MONDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1910.

UPON the application of the above-named union, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, and giving fuller effect to the agreement on which the said award was based, this Court doth order that the following amendments shall be and the same are hereby made in the said award:—

(a.) The words “the average to be taken on the previous year” are added at the end of clause 5 (j) thereof.

(b.) The following clause is added to the said award:—

“*Boiling Water.*”

“7A. Employers shall supply boiling water at dinner-time for the workmen, this duty to be relegated to the youngest apprentice in each department.”
