

(2681.) NORTHERN DISTRICT (EXCEPT GISBORNE) BAKERS AND
PASTRYCOOKS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award made on the 25th day of October, 1912, in an industrial dispute between the Auckland Operative Bakers and Pastrycooks' Industrial Union of Workers and Archibald and Gibson and other employers.

Thursday, the 28th day of November, 1912.

FOR the purpose of remedying a defect in the above-mentioned award, this Court doth order that the said award shall be and the same is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph to clause 1 thereof:—

“(h.) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, those employers in the City of Auckland and the suburbs thereof who were working night shifts at the date of the making of this award may continue to work such night shifts for a period of not more than six calendar months from the 18th day of November, 1912. Such night shifts shall start not earlier than 10 p.m.; and all journeymen employed on such shifts shall be paid not less than 7s. 6d. per week in addition to the minimum wage fixed by this award. Employers working such night shifts (except for the purpose of delivering at trains and steamers) shall not start their carts from their premises at an earlier hour than 7 a.m. on Wednesday and Saturday, and not earlier than 8 a.m. on the other days of the week.”
