

(2897.) WELLINGTON MATCH-FACTORY FEMALE OPERATIVES.—
AGREEMENT.

(Supplementary to award dated 12th June, 1913.)

THIS industrial agreement, made in pursuance of the provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, this 20th day of September, 1913, between Bryant and May, Bell and Co. (hereinafter called "the employer") of the one part, and the Wellington Match-factory Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union") of the other part, witnesseth, and it is hereby agreed, as follows:—

1. *Piecework Rates*.—For workers employed on box-filling machines:—

Box-filling by machines: Nos. 11 and 12 boxes—3s. 10d. per 12-gross case, including drawing of slides, to be divided between the eight or nine workers operating.

Plaid-box-filling by machine: 1s. 1d. per crate of 24 gross, to be divided between the workers operating as follows: Feeding and taking off, 5d. each, and tray-girls 3d. for each crate filled.

2. *Terms*.—This agreement shall come into operation on the 20th day of September, 1913, and remain in force until the 12th day of June, 1916.
