

(2948.) INVERCARGILL PERFORMING MUSICIANS.—AGREEMENT
WITH LYCEUM HALL COMPANY (LIMITED).

THIS industrial agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, this 27th day of November, 1913, between the Lyceum Hall Company (Limited), a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the employer"), of the one part, and the Invercargill Performing Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union") of the other part, whereby it is agreed as follows:—

1. As between the union and the members thereof and the employers all the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in this agreement shall be binding upon the union and every member thereof and upon the employer, and the said union and every member thereof and the employer shall respectively do, observe, and perform all the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed.

2. This agreement shall come into force on the 27th day of November, 1913, and shall continue in force until the 27th day of November, 1916.

3. This agreement shall apply to all musicians employed to play musical instruments in connection with dramatic performances and variety and picture entertainments.

4. Each performer shall be paid at the rate of not less than £2 2s. per week for six nights and one matinee, with one rehearsal of not more than one hour and a half free.

5. Every casual performer shall be paid not less than 10s. for each performance. A performer shall be deemed to be a casual if his employment is for a period of less than six nights.

6. This agreement is limited in its operation to the area within a radius of five miles from the Invercargill Post-office.
