MEMORANDUM AS TO APPLICATION TO ADD PARTIES TO THE WELLINGTON BAKERS AND PASTRYCOOKS' AWARD (Book of Awards, Vol. xiii, p. 757).

The only question raised in connection with this application was as to whether the proprietors of certain tea-rooms should be added as parties to the award. The Court has not added them as parties. A complaint was made on behalf of employers in Palmerston North and Wanganui that the proprietors of certain tea-rooms were competing seriously in business with pastrycooks in the way of catering, and of making and selling small goods, but this was not proved to the satisfaction of the Court. If it can be proved clearly that the proprietors of any tea-rooms are competing substantially with pastrycooks in the way suggested, an application may be made to have such proprietors added as parties to the award, and the matter will be considered by the Court. It is useless, however, to bring before the Court any application to have tea-rooms generally brought under the operation of the award.
