(2841.) NORTHERN, WELLINGTON, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND FACTORY TAILORESSES, MACHINISTS, CUTTERS AND PRESSERS,—ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Industrial Districts.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award made on the 17th day of March, 1913, in an industrial dispute between the New Zealand Federated Tailoresses and other Clothing Trade Employees' Industrial Association of Workers and the New Zealand Wholesale Clothing-manufacturers' Industrial Association of Employers.

(a.) They shall pay to the workers employed by them in making ladies' tweed costumes manufactured for the wholesale trade not less than the wages mentioned in clauses 4 and 7 of the said award for a week of forty-five hours.

(b.) They are exempted from the other provisions of the said award.
