

(4013.) CANTERBURY ENGINEERS, METAL-WORKERS' ASSISTANTS,
AND RANGE-WORKERS. — ORDER AMENDING AWARDS *RE*
AMALGAMATION OF UNIONS.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 15th day of February, 1911, made in an industrial dispute between the Canterbury Metal-workers' Assistants' Industrial Union of Workers and Andersons Limited and others; and in the matter of an award dated the 19th day of December, 1910, made in an industrial dispute between the Christchurch Branch of the Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Union of Workers and J. Anderson and Sons and others; and in the matter of an award dated the 11th day of December, 1908, made in an industrial dispute between the Christchurch Range-workers' Industrial Union of Workers and T. Atkinson and others.

THE above-named unions desiring to amalgamate so as to form one union, and having taken steps to carry out such desire by registering a new industrial union under the name of "The Christchurch Branch of the Amalgamated Society of Engineers (including Brass-finishers), Range-workers, and Metal-workers' Assistants' Industrial Union of Workers," and application having been made to the Court for an order under section 20 of the said Act, this Court doth order that the said awards shall be and the same are

hereby amended by substituting the name of the union last mentioned as a party to the said awards in lieu of the above-named unions respectively.
