

(4382.) AUCKLAND FARRIERS AND BLACKSMITHS. — ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District. — In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 18th day of March, 1916, made in an industrial dispute between the Auckland Farriers and General Blacksmiths' Industrial Union of Workers and R.
