

(4391.) NORTHERN DISTRICT BOILERMAKERS.—AMENDMENT OF
AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District. — In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 30th day of June, 1915, made in an industrial dispute between the Auckland Boilermakers, Iron-ship Workers, and Bridge-builders' Industrial Union of Workers and the Auckland Gas Company and others.

Wednesday, the 9th day of August, 1916.

UPON reading the application of the said union filed herein on the 1st day of August, 1916, and the agreement arrived at between the said union and the Ironmasters' Section of the Auckland Provincial Employers' Association, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the said association, and there being no appearance of or objection from any of the employers bound by the said award, this Court doth order that the said award be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

By inserting after clause 4 (a) thereof the following subclause:—
“So long as the British Empire remains at war with Germany and Austria or either of them, and for three months after the declaration of peace, there shall be paid to adult workers, in addition to their present wages, a war bonus of 1d. per hour.”

This order shall take effect from the 14th day of August, 1916.
