

(4269.) MARLBOROUGH BUILDING TRADES.—AMENDMENT OF  
AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Marlborough Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award, dated the 15th day of April, 1916, made in an industrial dispute between the Marlborough Building Trades Industrial Union of Workers and F. W. Adams and others.

Saturday, the 15th day of April, 1916.

By virtue of section 90, subsection (1) (a), of the said Act, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, this Court doth order that the said award be and the same is hereby amended as from the date hereof by adding to clause 2 of the said award the following subclause:—

“2A. On all outside jobs where four or more workers are employed the worker responsible for carrying out the work—that is to say, who has charge of the plans and gives instructions to the other workers—shall be paid not less than 1s. per day in addition to the above-mentioned wage.”
