

(4284.) CHRISTCHURCH HORSE-DRIVERS.—SUPPLEMENTARY AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS by an industrial agreement dated the 26th day of January, 1914, and published in Book of Awards, Volume xv, page 35, it was directed (*inter alia*) in clause 2 (a), "The minimum wage for drivers shall be as follows: For those driving and attending to one horse, £2 8s. per week; for those driving and attending to two or more horses. £2 12s. per week":

This industrial agreement, made in pursuance of section 29 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, between the original parties thereto—viz., the Christchurch Horse and Commercial Motor Drivers' Industrial Union of Workers of the one part, and the Canterbury Employers of Drivers' Industrial Union of Employers and the persons, firms, and companies whose signatures were subscribed to the aforesaid agreement of the other part—mutually agreed that the said clause 2 (a) shall be varied by the addition of the words, "and in addition thereto during the continuation of the war the sum of 4s. per week additional to the £2 8s. and £2 12s."; and such addition shall be read as part of the original agreement as from the 1st day of May, 1916, and shall be enforceable in the manner provided by section 13 (1), (2), and section 14 and its subclauses, of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908.

In witness whereof the parties have executed these presents this 1st day of May, 1916.
