

(4555.) CANTERBURY FURNITURE TRADE AND CHRISTCHURCH LEADLIGHT AND GLASS WORKERS.—ORDER ADJUSTING TERMS OF AWARDS ON AMALGAMATION OF UNIONS.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 10th day of September, 1915, made in an industrial dispute between the Christchurch United Furniture Trades and Rattan and Wicker Workers' Industrial Union of Workers and Archbold Bros. and others; and in the matter of an award dated the 8th day of September, 1915, made in an industrial dispute between the Christchurch Rattan and Wicker Workers' Industrial Union of Workers and Henry Burson and Sons and others; and in the matter of an award dated the 20th day of December, 1915, made in an industrial dispute between the Christchurch Leadlight and Glaziers' Industrial Union of Workers and Bradley Bros. and others.

UPON reading the notice of motion filed herein on the 12th day of December, 1916, and upon hearing Mr. Ellis, the secretary of the said unions, and it appearing to this Court that the said unions desire to amalgamate under the name of "The Christchurch Furniture Trade, Leadlight, Glass, Rattan, and Wicker Workers' Industrial Union of Workers," and have taken steps under section 20 of the said Act to carry out such amalgamation, this Court doth order, by virtue of subsection (2) of section 20 of the said Act, that the awards above mentioned be and the same are hereby adjusted by substituting in the said awards the name of "The Christchurch Furniture Trade, Leadlight, Glass, Rattan, and Wicker Workers' Industrial Union of Workers" for the names of the said unions respectively.
