

(4730.) CANTERBURY SHIPWRIGHTS AND BOATBUILDERS.—
SUPPLEMENTARY AGREEMENT.

THIS industrial agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, this 26th day of July, 1917, between J. D. Miller, Messrs. Miller Bros., D. Grubb, J. Sinclair, master shipwrights and boatbuilders, and the Lyttelton Branch Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners (Shipwright Section), provides that so long as the British Empire remains in a state of war with Germany or Austria or either of them, and for three months after the cessation of such war, there shall be paid to all journeymen workers employed as shipwrights or boatbuilders a war bonus of 1d. per hour in addition to the rate of wages prescribed under the award of the Court dated 20th June, 1916.

This agreement to come into operation as from Monday, August 6th, 1917.

NOTE.—Section 25, subsection (4), of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, provides that, notwithstanding the expiry of the term of the industrial agreement, it shall continue in force until superseded by another industrial agreement or by an award of the Court of Arbitration, except where the registration of an industrial union of workers bound by such agreement has been cancelled.
