



(4788.) WELLINGTON (TWENTY-FIVE MILE RADIUS) PRIVATE-HOTEL, OYSTER-SALOON, RESTAURANT, LUNCHEON, TEA-ROOM, AND REFRESHMENT-ROOM WORKERS.—AMENDING AND ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District. — In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 13th day of November, 1917, made in an industrial dispute between the Wellington District Hotel, Club, and Restaurant Workers' Industrial Union of Workers and Mrs. E. Cockayne and others.

Tuesday, the 13th day of November, 1917.

By virtue of section 92 (1) (a) of the said Act, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, this Court doth order that the said award be and it is hereby amended as follows, that is to say,—

(1.) By inserting in clause 4 (e) hereof, after the words "culinary operations," the following paragraph:—

"*Females.*—In establishments where females are employed in the kitchen or scullery the minimum scale of pay for such workers shall be in the proportion of not less than three-fourths of the scale prescribed for males in similar capacities, provided that no such female shall be paid less than £1 5s. per week."
