

(4586.) DUNEDIN PAINTERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD *RE*  
WAR BONUS.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 22nd day of July, 1916, made in an industrial dispute between the Dunedin Painters' Industrial Union of Workers and the Dunedin Master Painters' Industrial Union of Employers and others.

Tuesday, the 27th day of February, 1917.

UPON reading the application filed herein on the 21st day of February, 1917, by the union of workers above named and the Otago Painters' Industrial Union of Employers, and with the consent of the employers, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the parties, this Court doth order that the terms agreed upon by the said unions of employers and workers in respect of a war bonus as contained in the said application be and they are hereby embodied in the said award—that is to say, after clause 2 of the said award the following provisions shall be inserted:—

“(a.) For a period of twelve calendar months as from the 1st day of May, 1917, the rate of wages provided in the preceding clause shall be increased by a war bonus of 1s. per day.

“(b.) At the expiration of the said twelve calendar months the said war bonus of 1s. per day shall continue to be paid until notice of its discontinuance shall have been forwarded by the employers to the union.”
