

4965.) DUNEDIN (FIFTEEN-MILE RADIUS) PRIVATE-HOTEL, OYSTER-SALOON, RESTAURANT, LUNCHEON-ROOM, TEA-ROOM, AND REFRESHMENT-ROOM WORKERS.—STRIKING OUT PARTY TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 14th day of December, 1917, made in an industrial dispute between the Otago Hotel, Restaurant, and Boardinghouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers and the Dunedin Private-hotel and Restaurant Employers' Industrial Union of Employers and others; and in the matter of an order dated the 14th day of March, 1918, made between the same parties.

UPON reading the application of Mrs. E. A. Stenhouse filed herein on the 18th day of June, 1918, in respect of the premises known as the "Imperial Private Hotel," situated at 302 Princes Street, Dunedin, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the applicant above named and of the union, and the evidence called in support of the said application, this Court doth order that nothing in the said award contained nor in the said order shall apply to Mrs. E. A. Stenhouse in respect of the premises aforesaid so long as she shall continue to conduct and carry on the business of a private-boardinghouse keeper as at present carried on by her.
