

(4998.) AUCKLAND (FIFTEEN-MILE RADIUS) STOREMEN AND
PACKERS.—STRIKING OUT PARTIES TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District. — In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 14th day of May, 1918, made in an industrial dispute between the Auckland City United Storemen's Industrial Union of Workers and Abbott, Foote, and Jones and others.

Saturday, the 14th day of September, 1918.

UPON reading the application of the above-named union filed herein on the 18th day of June, 1918, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers respectively, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, this Court doth order that the said award be and the same is hereby amended by striking out from the list of employers to be bound thereby the following, viz. :—
