

(5049.) OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND RANGE-WORKERS.—ORDER
INCREASING WAR BONUS.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 22nd day of April, 1918, made in an industrial dispute between the Amalgamated Society of Engineers' (including Brass-finishers, Coppersmiths and Range-workers, Cycle and Motor Mechanics, Tinsplate and Sheet-metal Workers) Industrial Union of Workers and Barningham and Co. (Limited) and others.

Tuesday, the 26th day of November, 1918.

UPON reading the application of the above-named union filed herein on the 18th day of November, 1918, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers respectively, and by virtue of the power reserved by clause 4 (b) of the said award, this Court doth order that the war bonus provided by clause 4 (a) of the said award be increased by $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour; and the said award is hereby amended by deleting the words " $1\frac{1}{2}$ d." where they occur in the said subclause, and by substituting in lieu thereof the words "3d."

This order shall come into force and shall take effect on the 9th day of December, 1918.
