

(4872.) WELLINGTON (TWENTY-FIVE-MILE RADIUS) PRIVATE-HOTEL, OYSTER-SALOON, RESTAURANT, LUNCHEON-ROOM, TEA-ROOM, AND REFRESHMENT-ROOM WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 13th day of November, 1917, made in an industrial dispute between the Wellington District Hotel, Club, and Restaurant Workers' Industrial Union of Workers and Mrs. T. Black and others.

Wednesday, the 13th day of March, 1918.

By virtue of section 92, subsection (1) (a), of the said Act, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, this Court doth order that clause 19, subclause (b), of the said award be and the same is hereby deleted from the said award, and in substitution therefor the following subclause shall be deemed to be incorporated in and to form part of the said award:—

“(b.) The only employers intended to be bound by the provisions of this award (other than restaurant-keepers, luncheon-room, tea-room, refreshment-room, and oyster-saloon keepers) are those named herein under the heading of ‘Private-hotel Keepers’ and their respective successors in business, and each of such employers and their respective successors in business shall be bound only in respect of any of the specified establishments which he or she may for the time being conduct, and the provisions of section 90, subsection (3), of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, shall not apply so as to extend this award to employers in other similar establishments unless they are hereafter expressly added as parties to the award.”
