

(4911.) DUNEDIN (FIFTEEN-MILE RADIUS) PRIVATE-HOTEL, OYSTER-SALOON, TEA-ROOM, AND REFRESHMENT-ROOM WORKERS.—STRIKING OUT PARTIES TO AWARD.
