## (5256.) HAWKE'S BAY CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Hawke's Bay Carpenters and Joiners' award, recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xviii, p. 650.

Upon reading the application of the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners' Industrial Union of Workers (Napier, Hastings, and Dannevirke Branches), filed herein on the 18th day of April, 1919, and upon hearing the duly appointed representative of the said union, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue of the powers contained in the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. Clause 2 of the said award shall be deleted, and the follow-

ing provisions substituted therefor:-

 $\stackrel{\sim}{\alpha}$  2. (a.) The minimum wage for journeymen carpenters and joiners and joiners' machinists shall be 1s.  $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

"(b.) In addition to the minimum wage above prescribed there shall be paid to the workers above mentioned a bonus of  $2\frac{1}{2}d$ . per hour unless and until the Court shall otherwise order.

"(c.) On all outside jobs where four or more workers are employed the worker responsible for carrying out the work—that is to say, who has charge of the plans and gives instructions to the other workers—shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to the above-mentioned wage."

2. This order shall operate and take effect from the 30th day of June, 1919.
