## (5420.) CANTERBURY RANGE-WORKERS.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Canterbury Range-workers' award dated the 19th day of July, 1918, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xix, p. 632.

UPON reading the application of the Christchurch Branch of the Amalgamated Society of Engineers' (including Brass-finishers, Range-workers, Metal-workers' Assistants, Electrical Workers, Tinsmiths and Sheet-metal Workers, and Cycle-workers) Industrial Union of Workers filed herein on the 10th day of July, 1919, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, doth hereby order

that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say-

1. Clause 2 of the said award shall be deleted, and the following provisions substituted therefor :---

"2. (a.) Extra time shall be worked when required, and shall be classed and be paid for as overtime at the following rates: Time and a half for the first three hours, and thereafter double time.

"(b.) Double time shall be paid for all work done on Saturday afternoon, Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Show Day.

"(c.) No overtime need be paid for work done on the holidays for a week prior to Christchurch Show in connection with Show work.

"(d.) In computing the amount payable for overtime under this clause any bonus payable under any order of this Court shall not be taken into such computation."

2. This order shall operate and take effect from the 22nd day of September, 1919.
