

(5181.) CANTERBURY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT IRON AND BRASS
MOULDERS.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Canterbury Industrial District Iron and Brass Moulders' award dated the 18th day of December, 1917, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xviii, p. 1313.

UPON reading the application of the Christchurch Iron and Brass Moulders' Industrial Union of Workers filed herein on the 10th day of February, 1919, and after hearing the representative of the said union and the representative of the employers, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. Clause 3 of the said award shall be deleted, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

“ 3. (a.) The minimum wages for journeymen moulders (except machine moulders) shall be 1s. 7½d. per hour, and for machine moulders 1s. 6½d. per hour. Journeymen moulders working machines shall be paid 1s. 7½d. per hour.

“ (b.) In addition to the rates of wages above prescribed there shall be paid to the workers above mentioned a bonus of 2½d. per hour unless and until the Court otherwise orders.”

2. This order shall operate and take effect as from the 14th day of April, 1919.
