- (5759.) NORTHERN DISTRICT (EXCEPT POVERTY BAY) FELL MONGERS, TANNERS, AND SOAP-WORKERS.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.
- In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Northern District (except Poverty Bay) Fellmongers, Tanners, and Soap-workers' award dated the 23rd day of September, 1918, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xix, p. 889; and in the matter of an order amending the said award dated the 5th day of September, 1919, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xx, p. 938.

Upon reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 17th day of March, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the

employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The said order dated the 5th day of September, 1919, is

hereby cancelled, and this order is substituted therefor.

2. Subclauses (c) and (d) of clause 3 of the said award shall be

deleted, and the following provisions substituted therefor:

"(c.) In addition to the wages prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause there shall be paid to all workers mentioned therein a bonus of 4d. per hour unless and until the Court shall otherwise order. In addition to the wages prescribed in subclause (b) of this clause there shall be paid to all workers therein mentioned a bonus of $4\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour unless and until the Court shall otherwise order."

3. This order shall operate and take effect as from the 1st day

of January, 1920.
