

(6004.) CANTERBURY (OUTSIDE A RADIUS OF TEN MILES FROM CHRISTCHURCH) PRIVATE-HOTEL AND BOARDINGHOUSE EMPLOYEES.—ORDER MODIFYING AWARD AS REGARDS CERTAIN PARTIES.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Canterbury (outside a Radius of Ten Miles from Christchurch) Private-hotel and Boardinghouse Employees' award dated the 13th day of September, 1919, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xx, p. 1058.

UPON reading the applications of Janet McDonald, of "The Lodge," Hanmer Springs, and of Elizabeth Lahmert, of "Amuri Grange," Hanmer Springs, filed herein on the 7th and 8th days of June, 1920, respectively, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said Janet McDonald and Elizabeth Lahmert, and of the Canterbury Hotel and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, party to the said award, and by virtue of section 92, subsection (1) (a), of the said Act, and for the purpose of remedying

a defect therein or of giving fuller effect thereto, this Court doth order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say:—

With regard to Janet McDonald, or the proprietor for the time being of “The Lodge,” Hanmer Springs, and to Elizabeth Lahmert, or the proprietor for the time being of “Amuri Grange,” Hanmer Springs, the following special provisions shall apply:—

In lieu of giving their workers one full day's holiday in every seven consecutive days as provided in clause 2 of the said award, it shall be lawful for the said employers to suspend such holidays and to allow them to accumulate wholly or partially during the period from August to May (both months inclusive) in each year, and to allow such accumulated holidays on “full pay” to the workers entitled thereto during the months of June, July, and August in each year. In the event of any of the said workers lawfully terminating their employment without having received the holidays to which they were entitled under this award, payment in addition to the ordinary wages shall be made for such holidays.

This order shall operate and take effect from the 12th day of July, 1920.
