

(6258.) CANTERBURY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT TAILORING TRADE
(SHOPS).—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Canterbury Industrial District Tailoring Trade (Shops) award dated the 28th day of August, 1920.

UPON reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 19th day of October, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. Subclause (*g*) of clause 2 of the said award shall be deleted, and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

“(*g*.) With regard to pieceworkers, the time statement recorded in Volume xviii of the Book of Awards, at page 122 of the Supplement to the said volume, shall be deemed to be incorporated with and form part of this award, and shall be binding on the parties to this award. The said time statement shall for the purposes of this award be calculated at the rate of 1s. 4½d. per hour for males and at 1s. per hour for females.”

2. This order shall operate and take effect as from the date hereof.
