

(6417.) NEW ZEALAND MARINE COOKS AND STEWARDS (GALLEY STAFF) AND UNION STEAMSHIP COMPANY.—ORDER AMENDING INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the New Zealand Marine Cooks and Stewards (Galley Staff) industrial agreement with Union Steamship Company (Limited), dated the 30th day of August, 1918, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xix, p. 729; and in the matter of a supplementary industrial agreement dated the 7th day of February, 1920, made between the same parties.

UPON reading the application of the union party to the said industrial agreements filed herein on the 5th day of November, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the said company, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations, and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said industrial agreements, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said industrial agreements shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The minimum wages prescribed in the said industrial agreement as amended by the said supplementary industrial agreement shall be increased by a bonus of 10s. per month for all the workers therein mentioned, and such bonus shall be paid unless and until the Court shall otherwise order.

2. This order shall operate and take effect as from the 1st day of November, 1920.
