

(6583.) INVERCARGILL (TEN-MILES RADIUS) PRIVATE HOTELS, RESTAURANTS, TEA-ROOMS, AND OYSTER-SALOONS EMPLOYEES.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Invercargill (Ten-miles Radius) Private Hotels, Restaurants, Tea-rooms, and Oyster-saloons Employees' award dated the 16th day of April, 1919, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xx, p. 439.

UPON reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 24th day of November, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exer-

cise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The following subclauses shall be added to clause 3 of the said award:—

“(a.) In addition to the minimum rates of wages prescribed in clauses 1 and 3 of this award there shall be paid until the 6th day of March, 1921, the following bonuses, viz.: To male workers, a bonus of 3s. per week; and to female workers, a bonus of 1s. 6d. per week.

“(b.) The preceding subclause (a) shall be deemed to have operated and taken effect as from the 1st day of November, 1920.

“(c.) In addition to the minimum rates of wages prescribed in clauses 1 and 3 of this award there shall be paid, unless and until the Court shall otherwise order, the following bonuses, viz.: To male workers, a bonus of 15s. per week; and to female workers, a bonus of 7s. 6d. per week.

“(d.) The preceding subclause (c) shall be deemed to have operated and taken effect as from the 7th day of March, 1921.”
