

(6733.) CHRISTCHURCH PERFORMING MUSICIANS.—ORDER  
AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Christchurch Performing Musicians' award dated the 28th day of February, 1920, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxi, p. 107; and in the matter of an order amending the said award dated the 22nd day of June, 1920, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxi, p. 912.

UPON reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 23rd day of November, 1920, and upon hearing

the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The said order dated the 22nd day of June, 1920, is hereby cancelled, and this order is substituted therefor.

2. The following clause shall be added to the said award :—

“The rates prescribed in clauses 2, 3, and 4 of this award shall, unless and until the Court shall otherwise order, be increased by the following bonuses : To adult male workers on weekly rates, 9s. per week ; to female workers over twenty-one years of age, 4s. 6d. per week ; to females under the age of twenty-one years, 4s. per week ; and to hourly workers, 2½d. per hour.”

3. This order shall be deemed to operate and take effect as from the 1st day of November, 1920.
