

(6806.) MARLBOROUGH THRESHING-MILL EMPLOYEES.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Marlborough Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Marlborough Threshing-mill Employees' award dated the 4th day of June, 1920, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxi, p. 685.

UPON reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 6th day of November, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The following additional subclause is hereby added to clause 3 of the said award:—

“(c.) The minimum rates above prescribed in subclauses (a), (b), and (c) shall be increased by a bonus of 3s. per week to weekly workers, and by a bonus of  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour to hourly workers, unless and until the Court shall otherwise order.”

2. This order shall be deemed to operate and take effect as from the 1st day of November, 1920.
