

(6947.) OTAGO BUILDERS' AND CONTRACTORS' LABOURERS.—
ORDER STRIKING OUT PARTY TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an award dated the 18th day of March, 1921, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxii, p. 388, made in an industrial dispute between the Otago General Labourers, Builders' Labourers, Quarrymen, and Coal-yard Employees' (Builders' and Contractors' Labourers Section) Industrial Union of Workers and the Dunedin Builders' and Contractors' Industrial Union of Employers and others.

Wednesday, the 20th day of July, 1921.

UPON reading the application of the Oamaru Borough Council, filed herein on the 16th day of May, 1921, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the Oamaru Borough Council and the said union of workers respectively, and the evidence adduced in respect of the said application, this Court doth order that the name of the said Oamaru Borough Council shall be and it is hereby deleted from the list of parties to the said award.

MEMORANDUM.

The Court has decided that it is more convenient that a Borough Council should be joined as a party to the Local Bodies' Labourers' award, and has therefore struck out the Oamaru Borough Council from the list of parties to the Builders' and Contractors' Labourers' award. The order is effective as from this day, but in order to settle a question raised at the hearing the Court desires to make it clear that the award is binding on the Council until to-day.
