## (6484.) POVERTY BAY BAKERS AND PASTRYCOOKS.—ORDER AMENDING AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918; and in the matter of the Poverty Bay Bakers and Pastrycooks' award dated the 13th day of October, 1920, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxi, p. 1802.

Upon reading the application of the union party to the said award filed herein on the 7th day of December, 1920, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and of the employers parties to the said award, this Court, having regard to all the relevant considerations and being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other

power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say—

1. The following subclause is hereby added to clause 2 of the

said award:-

"(e.) In addition to the minimum rates of wages prescribed in this clause there shall be paid to each worker a bonus of 3s. per week unless and until the Court shall otherwise order."

2. The following subclause is hereby added to clause 3 of the

said award:-

"(d.) In addition to the minimum rates of wages prescribed in this clause there shall be paid to each worker, unless and until the Court shall otherwise order, a bonus of 6d. per day of eight hours, or  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour if employed for less than eight hours, with a minimum payment in the latter case of 3d."

3. The following subclause is hereby added to clause 11 of the

said award:—

"(j.) In addition to the minimum rates of wages prescribed in this clause there shall be paid to each apprentice a bonus of 1s.

per week unless and until the Court shall otherwise order."

4. This order shall be deemed to operate and take effect as from

the 1st day of November, 1920.
