

(7423.) WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT BAKERS AND
 PASTRYCOOKS' AWARD.—ORDER STRIKING OUT PARTY.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an application by Mrs. Copeland, Kitchenette Tea-rooms, Lambton Quay, Wellington, to be struck out of the list of parties to the Wellington Industrial District Bakers and Pastrycooks' award, dated the 29th day of September, 1922, and recorded in the Book of Awards, Vol. xxiii, p. 610.
