(7731.) OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND STOREMEN AND PACKERS.—  
AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Storemen and Packers' award, dated the 12th day of February, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxv, p. 66.

Monday, the 24th day of March, 1924.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section 92 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and for the

purpose of remedying a defect in the Otago and Southland Storemen and Packers' award, dated the 12th day of February, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. xxv, p. 66, this Court, being of the opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, doth hereby order that the said award shall be amended in manner following, that is to say:—

1. By deleting clause 15 of the said award, and substituting the following provision therefor:—

“ 15. (a.) This award shall operate throughout the Otago and Southland Industrial District.

“ (b.) In establishments in which both wholesale and retail businesses are carried on the provisions of this award shall apply only to workers employed in the wholesale departments of such establishments.

“ (c.) This award shall apply only to workers who are substantially employed as storemen or packers, and shall not apply to workers who may be employed occasionally to do the work of storemen, but the greater part of whose time is devoted to other work in the establishment in which they are employed.”

2. This order shall operate and take effect as from the date hereof.
