(8002.) HAMILTON DISTRICT PLUMBERS AND GASFITTERS.— DELEGATING POWERS TO APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the conditions of apprenticeship in the plumbing and gasfitting industry within the Hamilton District.

Monday, the 29th day of December, 1924.

Whereas, on the 26th day of September, 1924, an order was made under the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, prescribing the wages, hours, and other conditions of employment to be incorporated in contracts of apprenticeship in the plumbing and gasfitting industry in the Northern Industrial District: And whereas an Apprenticeship Committee has been set up for the Hamilton Subdistrict: And whereas the said committee has applied to the Court to have delegated to it the powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Court doth hereby order that as from the 1st day of January, 1925, the said powers be and the same are hereby delegated to the said

committee in so far as these powers relate to the said industry in that area lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office at Hamilton, but reserving nevertheless power to the Court at any time and from time to time to withdraw all or any of such powers.
