

(8303.) CANTERBURY BAKERS AND PASTRYCOOKS.—DELEGATING
POWERS TO APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the conditions of apprenticeship in the baking and pastrycooking industry within the Canterbury Industrial District.

Thursday, the 27th day of August, 1925.

WHEREAS, on the 26th day of November, 1924, an order was made under the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, prescribing the wages, hours, and other conditions of employment to be incorporated in contracts of apprenticeship in the baking and pastrycooking industry in the Canterbury Industrial District: And whereas an Apprenticeship Committee has been set up for the Canterbury Industrial District: And whereas the said Committee has applied to the Court to have delegated to it the powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Court doth hereby order that, as from the 7th day of September, 1925,

the said powers be and the same are hereby delegated to the said committee in so far as those powers relate to the said industry and locality, but reserving nevertheless power to the Court at any time and from time to time to withdraw all or any of such powers.
