

(8304.) CANTERBURY PLASTERERS.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the Canterbury Plasterers' apprenticeship order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1467.

Friday, the 28th day of August, 1925.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the plastering trade in the Canterbury Industrial District has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Canterbury Plasterers' Apprenticeship Order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1467: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by inserting the following clause after clause 5 thereof:—

“5A. An employer before taking an apprentice to learn the trade of a plasterer shall first apply to the committee for its approval, and shall satisfy the committee that he has the facilities for properly teaching him the trade.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
