(8393.) OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND BAKERS AND PASTRYCOOKS.— DELEGATING POWERS TO APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Bakers and Pastrycooks' apprenticeship order, dated the 26th day of November, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1306.

Monday, the 19th day of October, 1925.

Whereas, on the 26th day of November, 1924, an order was made under the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, prescribing the wages, hours, and other conditions of employment to be incorporated in contracts of apprenticeship in the baking and pastrycooking industry in the Otago and Southland Industrial District: And whereas an Apprenticeship Committee has been set up for the Southland Sub-

district: And whereas the said committee has applied to the Court to have delegated to it the powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Court doth hereby order that, as from the 26th day of October, 1925, the said powers be and the same are hereby delegated to the said committee in so far as these powers relate to the said industry in the Southland Subdistrict, but reserving nevertheless power to the Court at any time and from time to time to withdraw all or any of such powers.
