

(8405.) OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND PAINTERS AND DECORATORS.—
DELEGATING POWERS TO APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Painters and Decorators' apprenticeship order, dated the 21st day of November, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1294.

Friday, the 6th day of November, 1925.

WHEREAS, on the 21st day of November, 1924, an order was made under the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, prescribing the wages, hours, and other conditions of employment to be incorporated in contracts of apprenticeship in the painting and decorating industry in the Otago and Southland Industrial District: And whereas an Apprenticeship Committee has been set up for that part of the Otago and Southland Industrial District under the supervision of the Dunedin Office of the Department of Labour: And whereas the said committee has applied to the Court to have delegated to it the powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Court doth hereby order that as from the 16th day of November, 1925, the said powers be and the same are hereby delegated to the said committee in so far as those powers relate to the said industry in that area lying within a radius of fifty miles from the Chief Post-office in the City of Dunedin, but reserving nevertheless power to the Court at any time and from time to time to withdraw all or any of such powers.
