(10238.) CANTERBURY TAILORS AND TAILORESSES.—PARTIAL EXEMPTION FROM GENERAL ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Finance Act, 1931; and in the matter of the Canterbury Tailors and Tailoresses' award, dated the 30th day of November, 1926, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVI, p. 1290.

Tuesday, the 15th day of December, 1931.

UPON reading the application of the Christchurch Tailoring Trades Industrial Union of Workers, party to the Canterbury Tailors and

Tailoresses' award, dated the 30th day of November, 1926, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVI, p. 1290, for exclusion from the operation of the general order of the 29th May, 1931, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and the employers parties to the said award, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 18 of the Finance Act, 1931, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, and with the consent of the parties, doth hereby order as follows:—

That the pieceworkers covered by the said award be excluded from the operation of the said general order of the 29th May, 1931, to the following extent, viz. : that the reduction of 10 per cent. in the piecework rate of 1s. 5d. be cancelled as from the date of the coming into force of the said order, and a reduction of 5 per cent. substituted therefor.
