

(10100.) WESTLAND CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Westland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Westland Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of June, 1927, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 611.

Monday, the 8th day of June, 1931.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the carpentering and joinery industry in the Westland Industrial District has made application to the Court for amendment of the Westland Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of June, 1927, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 611: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by striking out from the fifth line of the second paragraph of subclause (a) of clause 6 thereof the word "three," and substituting therefor the words "four and a half."

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
