(10118.) AUCKLAND TRANSPORT BOARD COACH AND CAR BUILDERS. —PARTIAL EXEMPTION FROM GENERAL ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Finance Act, 1931; and in the matter of the Auckland Transport Board Coach and Car Builders' agreement under the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913.

Tuesday, the 21st day of July, 1931.

Upon reading the application (filed 29th June, 1931) of the Auckland Coach and Car Builders' Union, party to the Auckland Transport

Board Coach and Car Builders' agreement under the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913, dated the 5th day of September, 1930, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXX, p. 777, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said union and the Auckland Transport Board, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 18 of the Finance Act, 1931, and of every other power in that behalf thereto enabling it, and with the consent of the parties to the said agreement, doth hereby order that the workers covered by the said agreement be excluded from the operation of the general order of the 29th day of May, 1931, to the extent hereinafter set forth:—

1. That the deduction authorized by the said general order of 10 per cent. from the minimum rates of remuneration fixed by the agreement above referred to shall not apply to the first £2 per week of the remuneration of any worker, but shall apply to any remuneration in excess of £2 per week.

2. That this order shall be deemed to have operated and taken effect as from the 3rd day of July, 1931, and shall remain in force until the 1st day of October, 1931.
