

(10145.) NEW ZEALAND TEA-ROOMS AND RESTAURANT EMPLOYEES.—STRIKING OUT PARTY FROM AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the New Zealand Tea-rooms and Restaurant Employees' award, dated the 9th day of May, 1930, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXX, p. 429.

Wednesday, the 22nd day of July, 1931.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 92 (1) (a) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the New Zealand Tea-rooms and Restaurant Employees' award, dated the 9th day of May, 1930, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXX, p. 429, this Court, being of the opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by striking out from the list of parties thereto the name of—

Convery, P. J., Tea-rooms, Waimate.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
