

(10286.) OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.—  
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 6th day of November, 1925, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVA, p. 1000.

Wednesday, the 10th day of August, 1932.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the carpentering and joinery industry in the Southland Provincial District has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Otago and Southland Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 6th day of November, 1925, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVA, p. 1000: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order, in so far as it relates to the Southland Provincial District, shall be amended by striking out clause 8 thereof and substituting the following clause therefor:—

“8. The minimum rates of wages payable to apprentices shall be 10s. per week for the first year, 15s. per week for the second year, £1 per week for the third year, £1 5s. per week for the fourth year, and £1 10s. per week for the fifth year.”

2. That this order shall apply only to apprenticeships commencing on and after the 15th day of August, 1932.

3. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the 15th day of August, 1932.
