

(10352.) CANTERBURY HAIRDRESSERS.—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Canterbury Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 21st day of August, 1925, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVA, p. 741.

Wednesday, the 21st day of December, 1932.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the hairdressing trade in the Canterbury Industrial District has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Canterbury Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 21st day of August, 1925, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVA, p. 741: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order, in so far as it relates to that part of the Canterbury Industrial District lying north of the Rangitata River,

shall be amended (a) by striking out from clause 5 thereof the word " five " and substituting therefor the word " three " ; (b) by striking out clause 8 thereof and substituting therefor the following clause :—

" 8. The minimum rates of wages payable to apprentices shall be as follows : 12s. per week for the first year ; 18s. per week for the second year ; 27s. 6d. per week for the third year."

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
