The Canterbury Retail Shop-assistants' (other than Grocers) Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union").

THE Court of Arbitration of New Zealand (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of the above-mentioned dispute, and having heard the union by its representatives duly appointed, and having also heard such of the employers as were represented either in person or by their representatives duly appointed, and having also heard the witnesses called and examined and cross-examined by and on behalf of the said parties respectively, doth hereby order and award:—

That, as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each and every of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto and of this award shall be binding upon the union and upon every member thereof and upon the employers and upon each and every of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated in and declared to form part of this award; and, further, that the union and every member thereof and the employers and each and every of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by this award and by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of this award or of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and perform the same. And the Court doth hereby further award, order, and declare that any breach of the said terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto shall constitute a breach of this award, and that a penalty as by law provided shall be payable by any party or person in respect thereof. And the Court doth further order that this award shall take effect as hereinafter provided, and shall continue in force until the 26th day of March, 1934, and thereafter as provided by subsection (1) (d) of section 89 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925.

SCHEDULE.

Interpretation.

1. For the purpose of this award every person shall be deemed to be a shop-assistant who is substantially engaged in any capacity in connection with the reception, display, or sale of goods, or orders for goods, in or for the retail establishments of those employers who are bound by this award: Provided, however, that this shall not include persons engaged in office work, or as message-boys or porters; and provided further that the provisions of the award shall not operate in respect of departmental managers and departmental manageresses.

Classification of Workers.

2. Shop-assistants shall be classified as "juniors" and "seniors." A "senior" is an employee who is in receipt of a weekly wage of not less than £3 15s. in the case of a male, and £2 in the case of a female. A "junior" is an employee who is in receipt of a weekly wage of less than £3 15s. in the case of a male and £2 in the case of a female. A "storeman" or "packer" is an employee substantially engaged in receiving delivery of, collecting, packing, unpacking, and dispatching goods.

Hours of Work.

3. The hours of employment shall be regulated by the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its amendments.

Overtime.

4. All time worked in excess of the daily minimum hours prescribed by the Shops and Offices Act, 1921–22, and its amendments, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half with a minimum payment at the rate of 1s. per hour.

Wages.

5. The minimum weekly rates of wages shall be as follows:—

6. (a) The minimum weekly rate of wages for storemen and packers shall be as follows:—

(b) Storeman or packer in charge of two or more men other than casuals shall be paid not less than 84s. per week.

(c) This award shall not apply to storemen and packers covered

by the Wholesale Merchants' Storemen and Packers' award.

(d) A senior storeman and packer shall be an employee in receipt of not less than 75s. per week.

Proportion.

7. (a) The number of juniors in any shop shall not exceed two to the first senior and one additional junior to each additional senior, provided that for every five seniors one additional junior may be employed. For the purpose of this clause an employer actively engaged in the management of his business may be classified as a "senior."

(b) The proportion of junior storemen and packers to seniors shall be the same as that fixed for assistants in the preceding subclause.

Temporary or Casual Hands.

8. (a) Casual hands shall be paid 20 per cent. in addition to the rate prescribed in the appropriate wages clause, or at an hourly rate equivalent thereto, with a minimum payment of 1s. per hour.

(b) An assistant shall be deemed to be a casual hand when employed for less than one week.

(c) During half-yearly sale-time permanent workroom hands may be transferred to the shop for one day or longer provided they are paid not less than the minimum rates prescribed in this award for permanent hands and not less than the wages they receive as workroom hands, whichever is the greater.

Tea-money.

9. (a) Notice shall be given prior to the time of ceasing work on the preceding day to any employee who shall be required to work overtime, and provided such employee when working overtime cannot reasonably get home for a meal, 1s. tea-money shall be paid.

(b) Under exceptional circumstances shorter notice may be given by mutual arrangement between the worker and the employer concerned, and in such case, provided the assistant cannot reasonably

get home for a meal, 1s. 6d. tea-money shall be allowed.

Weekly Employment.

10. (a) The employment shall be deemed to be a weekly employment, and no deduction shall be made from the weekly wages except for time lost through the worker's sickness, accident, or default.

(b) Not less than seven days' notice shall be given by either party of the termination of the employment except in the case of casual hands; but nothing in this clause shall prevent an employer from summarily dismissing any worker for misconduct.

Payment of Wages.

 (a) All wages and overtime shall be paid weekly or fortnightly and in cash.

(b) All bonuses, premiums, and commissions earned by assistants other than canvassers shall be paid in addition to the weekly wages specified, and on no account shall any deduction be made from the latter.

Females employed in Special Departments.

12. Any female who is employed wholly or substantially in manchester, furnishing, drapery, men's and boys' clothing, mercery, men's hats, men's hosiery, carpets, linoleums, bedding, furniture, and men's boots departments shall be paid 50 per cent. additional to the wages hereinbefore specified for females, but not so as to exceed in any case the corresponding rates specified for males.

Holidays.

13. (a) The following days shall be observed as full holidays: New Year's Day, 2nd January, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) Should any of the above holidays fall on a Sunday, then for the purposes of this award such holiday shall be observed on the

following Monday.

(c) Any work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Anzac Day shall be paid for at double time rates; work done on any of the other holidays specified herein shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half; such rates to be calculated on an hourly basis and the said payments to be in addition to the ordinary weekly wage.

(d) One holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker under this award on completion of each year of service, and at a time to be mutually arranged between the employer and the worker.

(e) Any worker who has completed six months' service leaving the service of the employer otherwise than for dismissal for misconduct shall be granted pay in lieu of the holiday mentioned in the preceding subclause in proportion to his or her length of service.

Weekly Half-holiday.

14. Except on the Saturday of the week preceding Christmas Day when Christmas Day falls on a Sunday or Monday, no assistant shall be employed after 1 p.m. on the statutory half-holiday. No overtime or extended hours shall be worked on any such half-holiday. Any assistant who has been employed for the major portion of the week shall be entitled to be paid for his or her half-holiday during such week.

Closing of Shops.

15. (a) In exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 69 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921–22, and section 17 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, the Court orders that all shops in those areas to which section 31 of the principal Act applies or may hereafter be applied shall be subject to the following provisions: That all shops shall be closed from 5.30 p.m. on four days of the week, from 9 p.m. on one day of the week, and from 12.30 p.m. on the day of the statutory half-holiday.

(b) All shops mentioned in the preceding subclause shall be closed from immediately after midnight of the previous day and shall remain closed on the days set out in clause 13 (a) as holidays or on days

observed in lieu thereof.

(c) This clause shall be read subject to the provisions of section 3 (2) and section 5 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921–22.

Reference.

16. (a) Each employee on leaving or being discharged from his or her employment shall, on request, be given, within forty-eight hours thereafter, a reference in writing stating the position held and length of service.

(b) Original references shall be the property of employees, and on request shall be returned within forty-eight hours after engagement.

Accommodation of Females.

17. In shops where not less than six females are employed reasonable dining-room accommodation shall be provided if required, also a cloak-room or enclosure in which reasonable privacy is secured for dressing and rest in case of temporary indisposition.

Travelling-time.

18. Any firm transferring a worker from one town to another shall pay such worker's fare, first-class, to the place where such worker is transferred. If the worker so transferred is discharged within one year of being transferred for cause other than misconduct, the employer shall pay the worker first-class fare to the town from which the worker was transferred, provided the worker's home was in such latter town and the worker desires to return thereto.

Preference,

- 19. (a) If any employer shall hereafter engage any worker coming within the scope of this award who shall not be a member of the union, and who shall not become a member thereof within fourteen days after his engagement and remain such member, the employer shall dismiss such worker from his service if requested to do so by the union, provided there is then a member of the union equally qualified to perform the particular work required to be done, and ready and willing to undertake the same.
- (b) The provisions of this clause shall operate only if and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any worker coming within the scope of this award of good character and sober habits to become a member of the union, upon payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s., upon a written application, without ballot or other election, and to continue a member upon payment of subsequent contributions not exceeding 1s. per week, and such fines as may be lawfully imposed on him for non-attendance without reasonable excuse at a specially called meeting of the union, of which written notice has been given to him or sent to him by post at his last address as notified by him to the union, or for misconduct at a meeting of the union, or for being more than three months in arrear, without reasonable excuse, in his contributions to the union: Provided that the maximum fine shall not exceed 2s. 6d. for non-attendance at a meeting of the union or for being in arrear with his contributions, and £1 for misconduct at a meeting of the union.
- (c) With the consent of an employer, a representative of the union may interview workers in the shop for the purpose of collecting union moneys due, provided that such collection shall not take place oftener than once a week, and shall be at a time to be mutually agreed upon by the employer and the secretary of the union.

Under-rate Workers.

20. (a) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed by this award may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of the worker after due notice to the union, by the local Inspector of Awards or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or other person in so fixing such wage shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or other person shall think fit to consider after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and such worker shall offer.

(b) Such permit shall be for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or other person shall determine, and after the expiration of such period shall continue in force until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to such worker by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause: Provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree in writing with the president or secretary of the union

upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Awards of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e) It shall be the duty of an employer, before employing a worker at such lower wage, to examine the permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

Scope of Award.

21. This award shall operate throughout the Canterbury Industrial District.

Term of Award.

22. This award, in so far as it relates to wages, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 27th day of March, 1933, and so far as all the other conditions of this award are concerned it shall come into force on the day of the date hereof; and this award shall continue in force until the 26th day of March, 1934.
